And the value-laden filter that we use to develop our identity, comes in part from the people around us that we trust. Initially it's parents, and then friends, and then ultimately it's the culture that we inhabit. We have no independent, self-sufficient and inward looking means of determining our identity. We're not really free to make up our own identities. We're coerced by the dominant beliefs of our own culture. Though we may we may want to think otherwise, taking on the values of our community is how we are wired as human beings. Our identity is shaped and pressed upon us by all sorts of cultural expectations: from a 'consumer' mentality that erodes Christian community, to the view that our life consists of our achievements, looks and possessions.

For this reason, we are commanded to be in the world but not of it (1 John 2:15-17; John 17:14-19). For this reason, the bible makes such a big deal of Christians meeting together as a church community (Hebrews 10:25). God knows us well: if we're to resist the temptation to conform to our surrounding culture, we need to regularly gather as a community that provides God-shaped encouragement. This is how we'll conform to our True Identity: an identity shaped not by what's *popular*, but by what's *true*. That's an identity worth having.

Collect

God of the new and eternal covenant, as the forty days of the great flood swept away the world's corruption and watered new beginnings of righteousness and life: grant to us who are washed clean and born again in the saving of flood of your grace, that your gift of new life may flourish once again; through Jesus Christ our Redeemer, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen

The Myth of Modern Identity

There is a modern idea that you must look inside yourself to discover your deepest desires and dreams, and express them. What you can never do is look outside yourself to find your identity. 'You be you' is the catch-cry of those who seek to be 'authentic'. The problem however of such a worldview is that it's simply not true.

The reality is that we all have strong inward desires, but unless we're psychopathic or entirely juvenile, we don't identify with all our desires. For some of our desires are contradictory, and some can indeed be harmful to ourselves and others. As a result, we suppress some of our desires, and to do this selectively we use filters. That is, we use beliefs and values to sift our hearts and determine which emotions and sensibilities we shall incorporate into our identity, and which we shall reject. As a result, what forms our identity is a valueladen filter, rather than our uncensored passions.
