# Bible Study - God's Kingdom (The Big Picture) Wk 7 - The Proclaimed Kingdom: 2 Corinthians 4:1-18

We live in the 'last days' between Jesus' first and second comings. God is patiently waiting for more people to come into his kingdom before he sends Jesus back to wrap everything up. Second Corinthians speaks about the harsh realities of life and the unbreakable faith that sustains us through difficult and dangerous times. Paul reminds us that all Christians are equipped by the Holy Spirit to serve Christ, are called to preserve in faith and are given the privilege of being called to the ministry of evangelism.
